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### Evergreen takes Tao Shu

TV distributor Evergreen Entertainment has acquired rights to a new kids' cartoon called Tao Shu, which is based on traditional Chinese peasant paintings and produced by Singapore抐 Peach Blossom Media.



The series (52x12' or 26x24') is aimed at three- to seven-year-olds and has already secured pre-sales to Nickelodeon Asia, TPS France, ATV Hong Kong and Arab language TV's Angad Films.



Tao Shu is set in ancient China and follows the adventures of its eponymous hero and his alter ego, Warrior Boy, injecting the country's traditional art with a modern twist.



The series has just completed production and is being presented as one of the highlights of Evergreen's Mipcom slate, which will also include Howdi Gaudi (26x24'), a Gaudins Projects/Steve Walsh/Agogo Media Production for TV 3 Catalunya. Set in a world inspired by Catalan architect Antoni Gaudi, Howdi Gaudi features flying elephants and chimneys that come to life.



Other Evergreen preschool cartoons include The Mole Sisters (13x30' or 39x10'), Spirello (24x 4'), a Cine Cartoon/Epidem Zot/Bonton Entertainment production, and Just Jamie (26x13'), a Funbag Animation Studios and Screentiger production for YTV in association with Twist Pictures.

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
